Janie Barrera

- President & CEO of ACCION Texas, a nonprofit corporation that provides small loans and management training to small business entrepreneurs
- Under her, ACCION Texas is now the largest microfinance lender in the country with a portfolio of more than \$20 million. Between 1994-2008, ACCION Texas made \$70.5 million in loans, producing \$113 million in economic activity & nearly 1,700 new jobs
- National recognition of ACCION including being the recipient of the 2008 Innovator Award from American Banker, the banking industry's premier publication
- Member of San Antonio Women Hall of Fame, Impact San Antonio, Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and many more!

Ethel Minor

- Long-time civil rights leader & political figure in San Antonio
- President of the San Antonio chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) from 1987-1996 & 2003-2006; Only female president to run the San Antonio NAACP chapter
- Helped organize the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day March Celebration during time as NAACP president which is now the largest annual civil rights celebration in the country with over 100,000 participants
- 2004 San Antonio Women's Hall of Fame Inductee
- Prior to her work with the NAACP, worked as a civilian at Kelly Air Force Base with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission
